Supporters of Brentwood Library Receive Opportunity to Participate in Travis Credit Union Foundation Challenge Grant program

The Travis Credit Union Foundation announced that the Brentwood Library Foundation, working in conjunction with the Friends of the Brentwood Library, has been selected to participate in the COVID-19 Relief Initiative.

The Travis Credit Union Foundation launched the initiative as a competitive program and awarded the challenge grants based on applications from nonprofit groups. The Travis Credit Union Foundation will match funds raised for each group once those funds for each group reach \$250 in community donations for a specific organization. The funds raised for the Brentwood Library will be used for special on-line programs aimed at students taking part in distance learning as well as additional resources to deal with the impact of COVID-19.
